## At Sea: Exp 380 NanTroSEIZE

Working toward the conclusion of the long running NanTroSEIZE program, this expedition aboard *Chikyu* will install a long-term borehole monitoring system (LTBMS) in NanTroSEIZE hole C0006, complementing two existing nearby subseafloor observatories as part of the Nankai Trough Seismogenic Zone Experiment (NanTroSEIZE). The LTBMS will connect to Japan's DONET undersea cabled network, sending pressure, strain, and seismic data to the mainland in real

time.

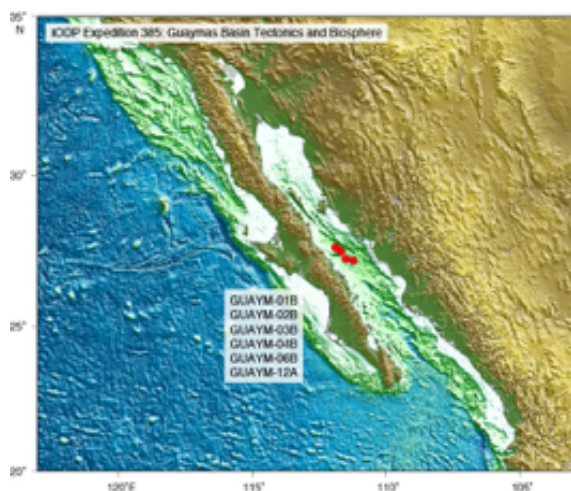
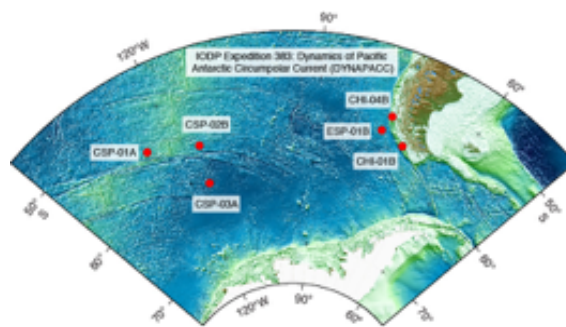
